Financially, the association finished the year with incurred expenses totaling \$14,623.50. Eightyone percent of expense is related to green space care. Revenues are dues-based and totaled \$14,986.46.

Over the past two years, our HOA recommended and collaborated with the SID for multiple upgrades, including signs, landscaping, sidewalks, and water supply for the entry irrigation system.
