#### In collaboration with Omaha:

The city improved the appearance of the circle at HWS Cleveland and Blue Sage and the Centennial entrance promptly after Susan contacted the Mayor's hotline.

#### In collaboration with our SID:

The conversion of the well based irrigation water for the entry green space to city water is completed. The vintage well pump system had broken late spring

Entry landscaping and replacement trees along Pacific street are to be planted this fall.

LED Lighting to the center of the front sign and up into the entry landscape bed trees was completed. Several HOA members suggested the illumination to center of the sign. Great suggestion and check that off as done!

## Tuscan Ridge vs. Emerald Ash Borer

The tightest density of ash trees are along the back lot lines of our homes between 200th Street & 199th Street and 199th street & HWS Cleveland(the villa area). Carol Davis, Jane Gauger, and Mike Ancona organized the Villa homes in an focused effort to minimize the loss of trees due to the EAB and to maintain the desirability of healthy trees. Through education, information, and effort, the Villa residents developed a comprehensive program of treatment and tree replacement approaches and gained group purchasing discounts for these updates. Congrats to the Villa group for their proactive action!

While tree maintenance at our homes is an individual responsibility, if another cluster of homes-with-ash owners wish to team together, the Villa folks are willing to share their experiences. Additionally, while supplies last, they have few packets of information on trees and the EAB approaches.

### **Commercial Zone Update**

Building in the commercial zone west of our homes is advancing on a daily basis. Most proximate to our homes will be a church-now in the design phase and the existing Family Fare. The HOA did meet with the developer for the plot south of Pacific. This will be a child care center and small professional strip mall.
